AGIC Symposium Update

- The 2022 Symposium will be an in-person event in Prescott.
- Costs have increased ~38% since 2019, when we last had an inperson conference, so the committee is recommending increases to the conference fees.
- Guest rooms will be \$138 per night. (including taxes & fees -\$155.46)
- Lisa Atkins, State Land Commissioner, will address a general session again.
- A printed full program will be discontinued and will be digital only.
 - A hardcopy one-page at-a-glance agenda will be provided.








The number of likes your Facebook Pages have at any moment


The total number of people following your Instagram accounts








Post engagement > Type


Mixed overview Jan 01 - Dec 31, 21

Referral traffic type f



Comparing 2021 to 2020 - Facebook




Comparing 2021 to 2020 - Instagram
